

Below is an example of a TB Test and how it should look:



INTERNATIONAL ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEST CERTIFICATE

Dependent on the player/ student's country of origin, you may be required to complete an International English Language Test (IELTS). The test must be done at an approved test centre and students must take the Academic Level Test. A score of 5.5 or above is required overall.

ACADEMIC GRADES

On some occasions, particularly with WAEC results, you will need to provide the students WAEC pin number and Serial Number, as shown below:



PROOF OF FUNDS - Bank Statement - MUST BE ON OFFICIAL BANK LETTERHEADED PAPER OR SCREENSHOT

To get a CAS / Visa, you need to show you have enough money to live in the UK to cover tuition and living fees.

You are required to provide a bank statement as detailed below:

The bank statement is a combination of Tuition fees totaling £4,843, plus living fees for the year which is £1136 per month x 9 months = £10,224. – Therefore your bank statement must show at least £15,200 to allow for currency exchange.

This money must be in a personal bank out for the student. OR a parent's bank with written permission for the student to have access to.

You must be able to show that the full amount of money has been in a suitable bank account for at least 28 consecutive days (finishing on the date of the closing balance) and ending no more than 31 days before your application.

Please see UKVI guidance notes regarding bank statements and accounts below:

Your own money, or your parent's or partner's money

The money can be in any form of personal bank or building society account, such as a current account or a savings account.

If you're using your own money, it must be an account you control.

If you're using your parent's or partner's money, it must be an account they control.

The money must have been acquired legally. For example, it cannot be money from working illegally in the UK.

The account must allow immediate access to the money.

You must have had enough money for 28 days in a row. The 28 days is calculated by counting back from the date of the closing balance on the most recent evidence you provide.

To prove this, you can provide any of these:

- bank statements these can be paper or electronic downloads
- building society passbooks
- certificates of deposit
- letters from your bank or building society

The evidence must be from no more than 31 days before the date you apply for your visa. It must show:

- your name
- the name of the bank or building society
- how much money is in the account

If the money is in a foreign currency, we will convert it to British pounds using the <u>spot exchange rate on OANDA</u> for the date of the application.

We may verify the evidence with your bank. If we cannot verify the evidence, your application may be refused.
